Rules

- (2) Never use more than 1 or 2 designs /borders
- (3) Never use more than 1 to 3 colors /borders.
- (4) Persevere to complete.

Purpose

To practice strokes, to make something attractive, & to develop perseverance.

Bars	
1. Slant lines from top down. 2. Color bars	
Rope	
1. Wavy lines 2. Color rope.	
Glow	
1. Sweep lines from bottom up. 2. Color glow.	
Lace	
1. Long "e"s. 2. Scallop tops.	
Lace 2	
1. Fat "m"s 2. Cluster 3 tiny circles	
Beads	
1. Full circles. 2. Color in dark outside to lighter centers.	
Cardinals	
1. "y"s 2. Add eye, beak. 3. Color bird red.	
Philodendron	
1. No. 3's, closed 2. Wavy line, stem 3. Green leaves.	
Lines	
1. With ruler, make a thick and thin line. Color.	

"s"

Start at 2:00 position on dotted line, go left for a wiggle around to touch the bottom line.

"S"

Begin at top line at 2:00 position and wiggle again to bottom line.

"i"

Start on the line, swoop up to dotted line, retrace to the line, curve and lift just after curve. Add the dot in middle of where the "i" points.

"t"

Make taller than "i" & cross on the dotted line.

"s"

Make a fuller swoop than for "i", drop straight down, curve back to join to swoop, and go back out and lift for the tail ending.
