<p><b>Rope</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- wavy lines</li> <li>- alternate colors</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Glow</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- swoop lines in two directions</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Lace 1</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- long 'e's</li> <li>- scallop &amp; shade</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Lace 2</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- fat 'm's</li> <li>- teardrops</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Beads</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- circles</li> <li>- highlight at top</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Plant</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- no. 3's closed</li> <li>- wavy line, stems</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Necklace</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- small 'o's inside 'o's</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Hearts</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- no. 3's touching</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Seaweed</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- wavy line</li> <li>- small 'e's or 'f's</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Cactus</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- wavy line</li> <li>- small 's's</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Ribbon - bow</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 2 wavy lines</li> <li>- alternate colors</li> </ul>	

To learn or review  
Cursive Hand-writing (1)  
Start 'i' and 't' on the line, swoop, retrace, and finish like sample.  
Cross 't' and dot over where the 'i' points.

(2) Review 'i'.  
For 's' make a fuller swoop than for 'i'; then drop down, curve to join swoop, return & finish.
